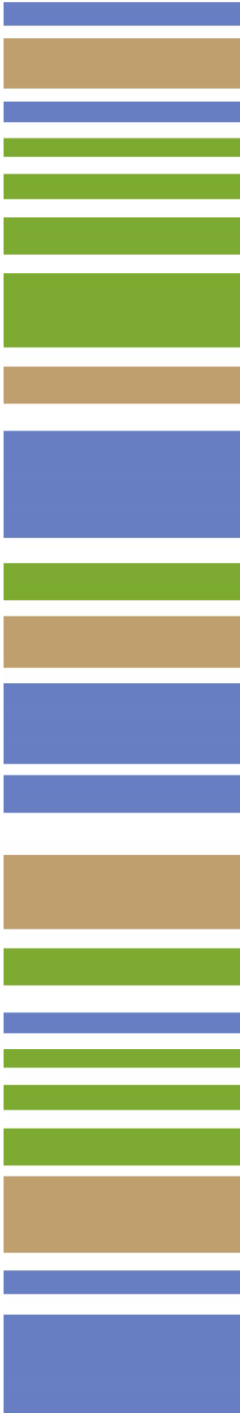

YOURSELF IN MEMORY






- **SMALL DISTRICT ARCHIVES** is a project financed by Ministry of Public Education and Ministry of Italian Culture with a contribution of 50 thousand euros - allocated within the "national cinema in schools plan" - with the subject of the secondary school Albertina Sanvitale and Ulivi high school.
- The project involves the research, digitization and enhancement of audiovisual memories (mostly amateur films) recovered among the inhabitants of the three neighborhoods symbol of the urban development of the city of Parma, namely Oltretorrente, Montanara and San Leonardo.



- The films (in 8mm format) or the tapes (vhs), freely digitized and returned to the owners, must contain images that document the life of the three neighborhoods (a wedding in the neighborhood church, a public park, a Sunday walk, or public events such as events, sporting events, parties, news or more).The exhibition Small Neighborhood Archives.



Family memories, videos and photos of the past, together with interviews, historical insights, are the result of a research work carried out by professionals together with the students and students of the Albertina Sanvitale and of the Liceo Giacomo Ulivi.

A personal way of living and interpreting Parma 2020, in a project designed to save city memories by returning them to the youngest and the community.

- The exhibition, reactivating family memories and collecting testimonies and stories from the inhabitants of the neighborhoods, was a large and multifaceted tool for students to help them interpret their city as the result of stratifications of lifestyles, cultural and social expressions, urban and previous lives.
